Delhi government launched scheme to set up 'Hobby Hubs' in government schools



The **Delhi government** has set up **Hobby Hubs** for government schools in Delhi after school hours to promote extra-curricular activities. This project will implement in the single shift government school. A project to set up 'Hobby Hubs' in government schools in Delhi with after-school dance, music, arts and crafts activities during this new academic session is in the works.

For the **2022-2023 academic session**, this project will only be implemented in single shift government schools. The idea is to make optimum use of school infrastructure and to use it after school hours to promote these extra-curricular activities.

Private academies, individuals and NGOs will be roped in to provide free training in fields selected by the schools. They will also be allowed to train private students during these sessions and charge them, but government school students will have to make up 50 per cent of the total students enrolled and no student of the concerned school will be denied admission into hobby classes being conducted in their own school.

RBI fixed WMA limit for States/UTs at Rs 47,010 crores

The Reserve Bank reduced the Ways and Means Advances (WMA) for states and union territories to Rs 47,010 crore from Rs 51,560 crore.




The Reserve Bank reduced the **Ways and Means Advances (WMA)** for states and

union territories to **Rs 47,010 crore from Rs 51,560 crore** on Friday, citing an improvement in the economic scenario. **WMAs** are short-term loans provided by the **RBI** to the government to help it deal with any discrepancies between **receipts and payments.**

KEY POINTS:

- Due to the uncertainty surrounding COVID-19, the RBI increased the WMA limit for all states to Rs 51,560 crore. The new WMA was in effect until March 31, 2022.
- **RBI** stated it has decided to revert to the **WMA** limitations deadlines and for **Over** Draft (OD) for state governments / UTs, as recommended by the Advisory Committee on Ways and Means **Advances** State to Governments, following a review of the limits and in light of the gradual easing of **COVID-19** restrictions.
- The Special Drawing Facility (SDF) used by state governments and UTs would continue to be linked to the amount of marketable securities issued by the government of India, such as Auction Treasury Bills, according to the RBI (ATBs).
- The interest rate on **SDF**, **WMA**, and **OD** will continue to be linked to the Reserve Bank's policy rate, the repo rate.

- The central bank further stated that interest will be charged for all days the advance is outstanding.
- The Government of **India's WMA** limit for the first half of fiscal year 2022-23 has been set at Rs 1,50,000 crore.

13 districts in Andhra Pradesh

YS Jagan Mohan Reddy, the Chief Minister of Andhra Pradesh, inaugurated 13 new districts in the state via video conference on Monday, April 4 in Tadepalli, Guntur district. As a result, there will be a total of 26 districts in the state.

The new districts were created using Parliamentary constituencies as a guide. With the addition of 13 new districts, Andhra Pradesh now has a total of 26 districts.

As part of the 26 districts of Andhra Pradesh, there will now be 23 revenue divisions. The CM added that people have accepted and liked the decentralised system of government because the initiatives are given straight to their doorstep, and that the same is now being extended to the districts.

The CM further mentioned that previously, one district served 38 lakh 15 thousand people, but today, with the establishment of 26 districts, each district will serve 19 lakh 7 thousand people.

March 2022: Gol had collected an all-time high of Rs 1.42 lakh crores as GST

The greatest ever GST was collected in March, which is a silver lining for the economy. The The Goods and Services Tax (GST) collection totaled Rs 1,42,095 crore.



The collected greatest ever **GST** was in March, which is good for the **economy**. The Goods and Services Tax (GST) collection totaled Rs 1,42,095 crore. breaking the previous high of Rs 1,40,986 crore set in January 2022.

KEY POINTS:

- The March 2022 revenues are 15% greater than the same month last year and 46% higher than the March 2020 revenues.
- Revenues from imports of products were 25% higher during the month, while revenues from domestic transactions (including imports of services) were 11% higher than in the same month last year.
- the month ofMarch 2022. the gross GST revenue collected was Rs 1,42,095 with **Central GST** at **Rs** crore. 25,830 32,378 crore, state GST at Rscrore, integrated **GST** at **Rs** 74,470 crore, including **Rs 39,131 crore** collected on imports of goods, and cess at Rs 9,417 crore, including Rs 981 crore collected on imports of goods.

The government has paid Rs 29,816 crore to the CGST and Rs 25,032 crore to the SGST as normal settlement from the IGST, according to

official data. This month, the Centre also settled **Rs 20,000 crore of IGST** on an ad hoc basis in a 50:50 split between the Centre and the states/Union Territories.

International Conscience Day was observed in 2020.
